<ul> <li>Bags MUST be empty, clean and dry without receipts, coins, or trash.</li> <li>Clean, dry plastic bags labeled #2 or #4:</li> <li>"HDPE," "PE-HD" OR ", "LDPE," "LLDPE"</li> <li>Including:</li> <li>Grocery &amp; produce bags</li> <li>Newspaper bags</li> <li>Dry cleaning bags (no receipts/staples)</li> <li>Plastic cereal bags (if it tears like paper do not include)</li> <li>Sandwich/Ziploc bags and bread bags: no crumbs, oils, food (remove large zippers)</li> <li>Retail bags (#2 or #4) with string/hard plastic handles removed</li> <li>Plastic outer wrap from packages of toilet paper, paper napkins, paper towels, diapers, sanitary products</li> <li>Bubble wrap, air pillows, plastic shipping envelopes (deflate air pillows/cut out labels)</li> <li>Case wrap from cases of water, canned pet food, soda, etc.</li> <li>Stretch wrap from furniture or electronics</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>NO - <u>DO NOT</u> RECTCLE <i>III</i> stores:</li> <li>NO bags with food or moisture</li> <li>NO garbage bags</li> <li>NO food or cling wrap (Saran)</li> <li>NO pet food product bags</li> <li>NO coffee bags</li> <li>NO prepackaged food bags (frozen food or prewashed salad)</li> <li>NO chip bags, granola bar/candy wrappers</li> <li>NO bags with paint or glue</li> <li>NO compostable plastic bags</li> <li>NO Tyvek envelopes</li> <li>NO bag with a recycling symbol or <i>#</i> other than those described in the "yes" column</li> <li>NO soil or sand bags</li> <li>What about pellet stove fuel bags?</li> <li>Some retail store plastic bag recycling programs will accept pellet bags (call first). Pellet bags must be dry and <u>completely</u> EMPTY.
