THE "YES AND NO" OF RECYCLING IN WESTERN MASS

Put plastic caps back on containers. cellophane food bags (e.g., straws, utensils, lids automotive products, pool ONLY containers smaller than 2.5 gallons are recyclable. candy bars, cookies, pasta) black plastic chemicals, pesticides, etc. food bottles, tubs, jars: yogurt, cooking oil, frozen food bags/pouches compostable plastics containers over 2.5 gallons: condiments, peanut butter, margarine, hummus liners from food packaging cookie travs 5-gallon pails, buckets, > beverage bottles and jugs: water, juice, soda, plastic plates blister pack packaging recycling bins, laundry baskets lawn furniture, swimming pools cups: color or opaque tubes: milk (empty, rinse if possible, put caps back ON) Styrofoam™ (polystyrene): toothpaste, hair care tarps soap bottles: dish soap, detergent, hand sanitizer cups/take-out containers hoses; PVC piping or tubing prescription pill bottles personal care bottles: hair products, soaps reusable water bottles CD, DVD, VCR tapes/cases egg cartons clear plastic clamshells (no black or Styrofoam™) packaging, peanuts syringes, sharps toys clear plastic cups, clear plastic egg cartons meat travs flower pots electronics holiday lights foil-wrapped pouches (kids drinks, fruit, baby food) Cartons frozen food boxes Recycle w/containers, not w/paper. Straws go in trash. ice cream cartons > milk and juice cartons (plastic spout OK) frozen juice cartons soymilk, soup, wine, drink boxes (no straws) plastic straws **Paper and Cardboard** shredded paper dirtied paper (pet waste, plastic bags, plastic packaging soda, seltzer, beer cartons Tyvek/ bubble wrap envelopes paint) Clean paper only. Flatten boxes. frozen food boxes stickers & sticker sheeting wet paper, wet cardboard "Windows" in envelopes, staples, paper clips, tape all OK ice cream cartons copy paper wrappers waxed paper or cardboard > newspaper, inserts, magazines, junk mail frozen juice cartons blueprints white, colored, glossy, and construction paper butter, margarine boxes hardcover books corrugated cardboard (tape OK) paper cups paper plates pizza boxes (empty: no food, wax paper, etc.)
